The objectives of this conference are to increase knowledge about the progress made in the prevention and control of cancers in women (including breast, lung, and colorectal cancers) through early detection; discuss the importance of the initial evaluation; explain the integrated management of early disease; present strategies for the management of recurrent or advanced cancer; describe the rehabilitation and psychosocial considerations of the gynecologic cancer patient and her family; and report on new research.

The conference is open to primary care physicians, oncologists, nurses, and students, as well as any other interested health care professionals.

This continuing medical education activity meets the criteria for 16 hours in Category I of the Physician's Recognition Award of the American Medical Association. Requests for continuing education credits will be submitted to the American Academy of Family Physicians, American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, and the American Osteopathic Association.

Advance registration is requested. There is no registration fee for students, interns, residents, and American Cancer Society Fellows or Career Development Awardees. The registration fee for physicians is \$200 before September 3, and \$250 thereafter. The fee for other health professionals is \$100 before September 3, and \$150 thereafter. A processing fee of \$50 will be charged for cancellations after initial registration.
